Update on New Tools: Pulse Checks and Spot Checks

The new Supply Chain and Health Services Spot Checks and Pulse Checks will allow for more frequent reporting to the Global Fund and its Board and serve as a mechanism to support Principal Recipients in identifying implementation bottlenecks and course correct as needed. It is mandatory to complete this tool but note that it does not inform grant rating.

Supply Chain and Health Services Spot Checks aim to improve visibility of (i) supply chain performance (ii) commodity and service availability (iii) service disruptions as well as strengthen assurance. Pulse Checks will capture timely data on (i) programmatic progress (ii) implementation disruption (iii) financial data to provide the Global Fund Secretariat with organizational visibility into implementation challenges and facilitate systematic problem-solving. (Note: Data will not be LFA-verified and will not be used for grant rating purposes.)	Global COVID-19 monthly monitoring survey completed by LFAs. The COVID-19 Indicator Monitoring (equivalent to the programmatic indicator module of the Pulse Check) currently covers 46 countries These two tools will be phased out by the end of 2021.	Principal Recipients will receive Pulse Checks from the Global Fund four times a year starting 4 October. The first Pulse Check covers the period 1 July to 30 September 2021 and the completed Pulse Check needs to be submitted within 30 days.	Principal Recipients of High Impact and Core portfolios.

Principal Recipients will start to receive Pulse Checks as of 4 October 2021 through the Global Fund Partner Portal and will have until 5 November 2021 to complete and submit them. It is important that Principal Recipients that have not yet submitted Grant Entity Data (GED) contact information do so as soon as possible to be able to access and submit the Pulse Checks.

Principal Recipients can submit Grant Entity Data information on "Editors" and "Submitters" following instructions sent by Country Teams.

Roles & Responsibilities				
Editors	 Are authorized by the Principal Recipient to access the Partner Portal to download the Pulse Check Excel form. Once completed, they will attach the Excel form back into the Portal. Can fill in data on the Pulse Check page of the Partner Portal. Are not able to submit the completed Excel or online form to the Global Fund. 			
Submitters	 Have the same rights as the editors (to download and attach the Pulse Check Excel form or complete data in the Pulse Check online form within the Partner Portal). In addition, they are duly authorized by the Principal Recipient to submit the Pulse Check Excel or online form to the Global Fund via the Partner Portal. 			

Supply Chain and Health Services Spot Checks

The "Spot Checks" will only be run in <u>45 countries</u> that have received a C19RM allocation higher than US\$20 million. If your country is not listed, "Spot Checks" do not need to be completed.

We would like to thank Principal Recipients for attending the information sessions and for your attention during the introduction of service providers Palladium, KPMG and IQVIA in your country.

As next steps, formal engagement among service providers, Principal Recipients, Country Coordinating Mechanisms and ministries of health will start at the beginning of October.

Tasks in which Principal Recipients will be involved in include: desk reviews, facilitating access of service providers to updated Master Facility Lists, facilitating or providing approvals for service providers to access health facilities and data and reviewing list of tracer products. Data collection will start in early October.

Progress Updates (PU), Progress Updates and Disbursement Requests (PUDRs) and Financial Closure Reports

Principal Recipients that haven't yet submitted the above-mentioned reports are requested to do so as soon as possible. These reports are of critical importance to the Global Fund, so that the aggregate progress, financial performance and absorption rates can be presented to support: 1) conversion of donor pledges into contributions, 2) building a stronger case for the 7th Global Fund Replenishment: high absorption rates of well performing and impactful grants make an even stronger case for much-needed funding for the three diseases and C19RM.
